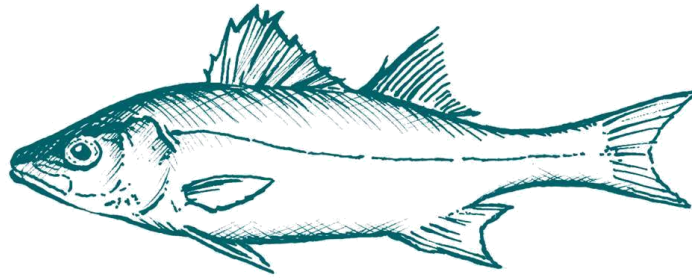


Recreational bass regulations 2020



Fishing with rod or hand line (at sea or from the shore)

1 January - 29 February 2020: Catch and release only

1 March to 30 November 2020: Two fish bag limit. You may not retain more than two specimens of sea bass each per day (00:00 to 23:59 hours)

1 December - 31 December 2020: Catch and release only

Minimum size: 42 cm

UK Bass Nursery Areas

There are six areas in Cornwall where bass are provided with extra protection at certain times of the year. In these areas during the closed period:

No bass to be retained when fishing from a boat

No sand eels to be used as bait when fishing from a boat

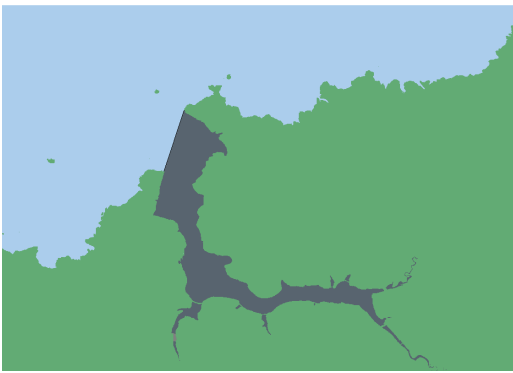
(Any bass caught when fishing from a boat to be immediately returned to the sea.)



1. Plymouth Rivers: All tidal waters enclosed by a line drawn 268° True from the western end of Mountbatten Pier to the landing beacon at Wilderness Point.

Closed all year

2. Camel Estuary: All tidal waters enclosed by a line drawn 020° True from Stepper Point to Pentire Point.

Closed 1 May— 30 November



3. River Fowey: All tidal waters enclosed by a line drawn 270° True from Penleath Point to the opposite shore.

Closed 1 May— 31 December



4. Helford River: All tidal waters enclosed by a line drawn 199° True from Rosemullion Head to Dennis Head.

Closed 1 May— 31 December



5. Fal Estuary: All tidal waters enclosed by a line drawn 045° True from Weir Point to Turnaware Point.

Closed 1 May— 31 December

6. Percuil River: All tidal waters enclosed by a line drawn 151° True from St Mawes Castle to Carricknath Point.

Closed 1 May— 31 December
